





**Reflections on Readings for
 Pentecost Sunday**

***"The Advocate, The Holy Spirit . . .
 Will Teach You Everything"***

Today is the Feast of Pentecost. It commemorates the coming down of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples of Jesus. The original Pentecost feast (Shavuot) commemorated the day that the first fruits of the harvest were brought to the temple.



It also commemorated the day God gave the Torah to the people of Israel. It is now also the day the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples to enlighten them and remind them of all that Jesus taught them.

Our first reading (Acts 2:1-11) tells the story vividly. Ten days after Jesus had been taken up to heaven, the disciples were celebrating the harvest festival of Pentecost. Jerusalem was filled with "devout Jews from every nation under heaven . . . Both Jews and converts to Judaism". "And suddenly, there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind". They were instantly enlightened and empowered and were given the grace to speak in tongues, so that everyone could understand them.

In our Epistle reading (1 Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13), St. Paul explains the many different spiritual gifts and forms of service that come from the same Holy Spirit. Each of us are called in some unique way by the Spirit to do God's will and God's work. Together, though we are many parts, we make up on body, the body of Christ, His Church.

In our Gospel reading (John 14:15-16, 23-26), Jesus, at the last supper, promised His disciples that the Father would send the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, and He would teach them everything; and Jesus, with the Holy Spirit, will come and make their dwelling with them. This promise is given to all those who love Jesus and keep His commandments (including us).

We have been reading in the Acts of the Apostles all during this Easter season of the "mighty deeds and wonders" performed by the Apostles and disciples of Christ. We also have heard of their incredible bravery and even joy in the face of terrible persecutions and martyrdom. All of this happened because of the gifts and graces given to them by the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Could the Holy Spirit, would the Holy Spirit give these same gifts to us? Would accept them? It starts with loving Jesus and keeping His word.

Cameron Soup Kitchen Charity Bike Ride

Have you ever thought "wow, I sure am fortunate"? - Yeah, me too...all the time!

Fr. Reif Celebrates 60 years of ministry!

From the time he was ordained, Father John T. Reif was strongly attracted to the prospect of being a parish priest — and that's exactly how his entire active ministry was spent.



"It was what I always envisioned," he said. "I do love people." Father Reif grew up in Rochester's Sacred Heart Cathedral Parish. He attended Aquinas Institute and St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries, and was ordained at Sacred Heart Cathedral June 5, 1965, by Bishop James E. Kearney. He went on to serve as assistant pastor at St. John of Rochester, Fairport (1965-70); St. Michael, Rochester (1970-74); and Our Mother of Sorrows, Greece (1974-78).

In 1978, Father Reif began a 20-year tenure at Webster's St. Rita Parish, first as copastor from 1978-81 and then as pastor until 1998. He oversaw construction of a new St. Rita Church building that was dedicated in 1984 and a parish center that opened in 1995.

In 1999, he became parochial vicar at Holy Cross Parish in Rochester/Charlotte. A strong supporter of Catholic education, Father Reif noted proudly that every parish at which he's served operated a Catholic school during his tenure.

He remained at Holy Cross after reaching senior-priest status in 2008, staying highly involved in parish life while also assisting at other parishes. In addition, Father Reif has been an ardent pro-life advocate over the years. Father Reif relocated to the Sisters of St. Joseph Motherhouse in 2019. He said he enjoys frequent outings and visits with his priest brethren, former parishioners, and other friends.

One such event is set for June 22: a 60th-anniversary Mass and reception at 10 a.m. at Holy Cross.
